Lately, when I am giving tours featuring our behind-the-scenes programs and facility, I get to enthusiastically share that our June 2024 electric bill came to \$15.

It took a conscious choice 2 years ago to install solar arrays on our roof, increase our capital campaign goal, seek out rebates and incentives and change to an underground 3-Phase electrical service. We focused our research, planned, held meetings with experts, and fundraised to make it happen. We changed our electrical goals and opened our facility to a complete interior face-lift to better serve customers. During this transformation we continued to deliver services to the community. Fiscal year 2023 was a phenomenal time of change.

I have noticed that companies throw the word “sustainability” around like crazy these days. I find myself digging into what their definition is and how they are actually making strategic moves to create a more sustainable business and culture. I find it fascinating. And it energizes me to help define how OUR 501(c)3 organization will do it when we make claims of being sustainable.

When you come to Good News Project now, you see a fresh new lobby and reception area, an additional clean space, new office spaces and a really cool workshop that is transforming our services. We are making progress on the final phases of our capital campaign. We have \$189,474 remaining to finish off all our building and supply upgrades. It is a smaller financial obligation

Health Equipment Lending Program

When you walk into the front door of Good News Project what do you see? A welcoming space, chairs for customers to sit, fresh carpeting and a friendly person to greet you.

What do you hear when you listen very quietly? Echoes from people that have entered the doors since July of 2023...."This is beautiful", "Oh my, what an improvement", "This change is what was needed", "I don't recognize the place – good for you!"

Yes, good for us ... and for the community as a whole!

The Health Equipment Lending program (HELP) serves people primarily in central and northern Wisconsin. By offering short-term loans of gently used medical equipment, people come to HELP instead of buying new home medical equipment that may only be used for a short time. This helps our environment by not producing so much and it fosters the "reduce, reuse, recycle" mantra (which we love).

We are serving more people and we are better serving those people. We have more space to stock clean, sanitized equipment. Our new software allows us to send email reminders when it is time for equipment to be renewed or returned. 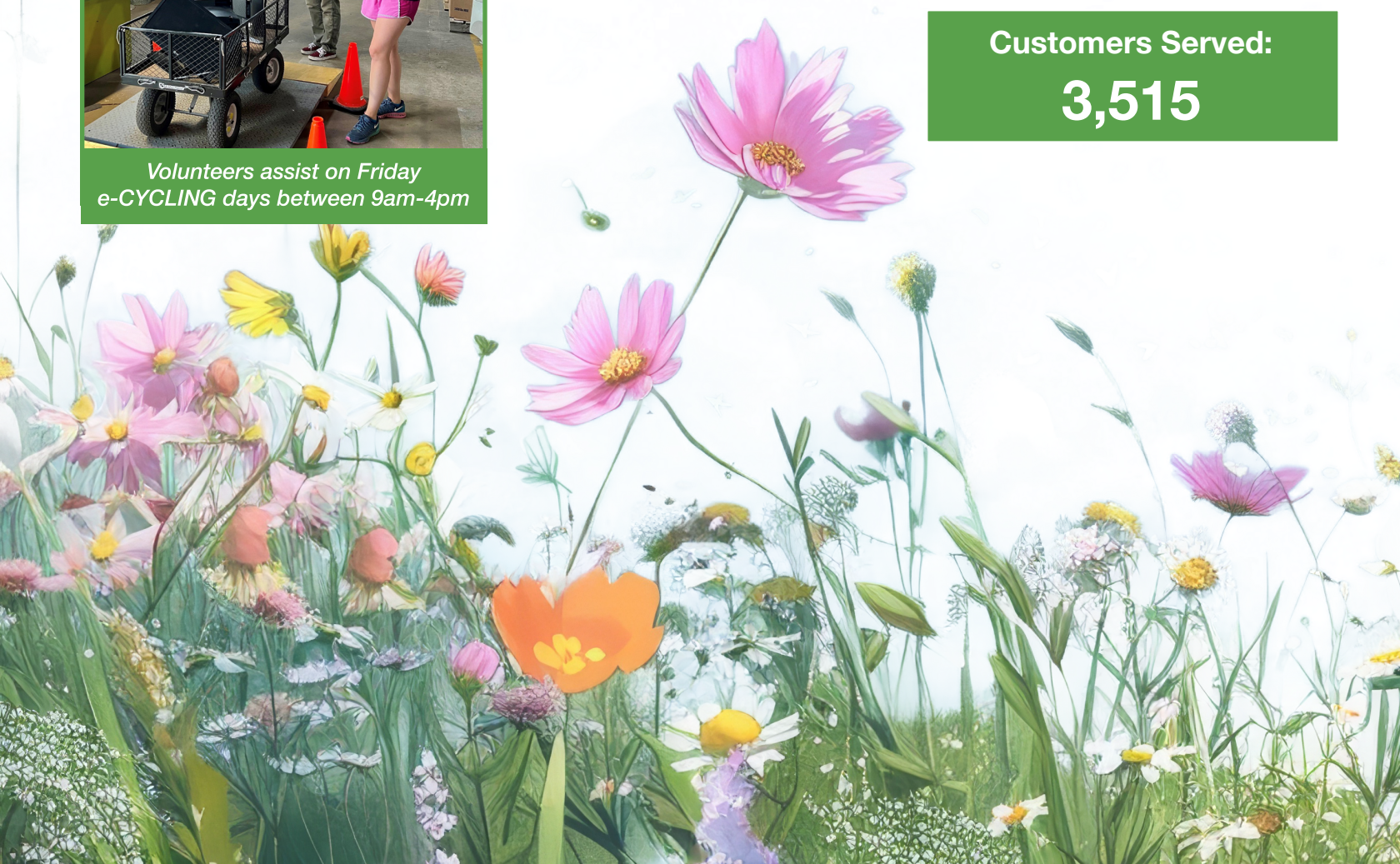

Math Camp St. Lucia - Planting Seeds of Economic Change

The silver lining to the 2020 hard stop of international travel was a current and purposeful assessment of the modern-day needs of our friends in the West Indies. It brought about a St Lucian-led collaboration to uplift the younger generation through education in remedial mathematics. The project name: Math Camp 2023-Together We Even the Odds.

The camp was built on the premise that students who can excel in math can excel in business and, eventually, economic development of their own country. Good News Project was proud to enter into this initiative during the summer of 2023 as a major sponsor and supporter. We were even more proud when we learned that pre and post-camp test scores for 15 and 16 year old students showed a tremendous increase in comprehension of concepts.

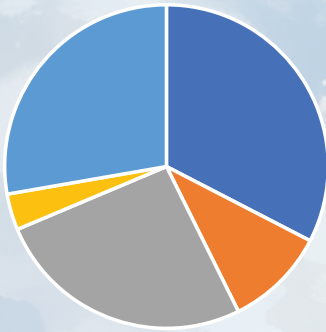

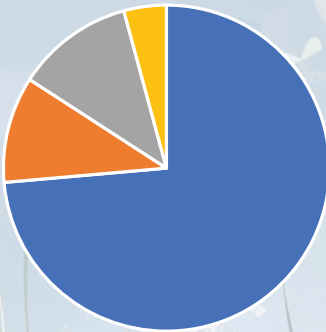

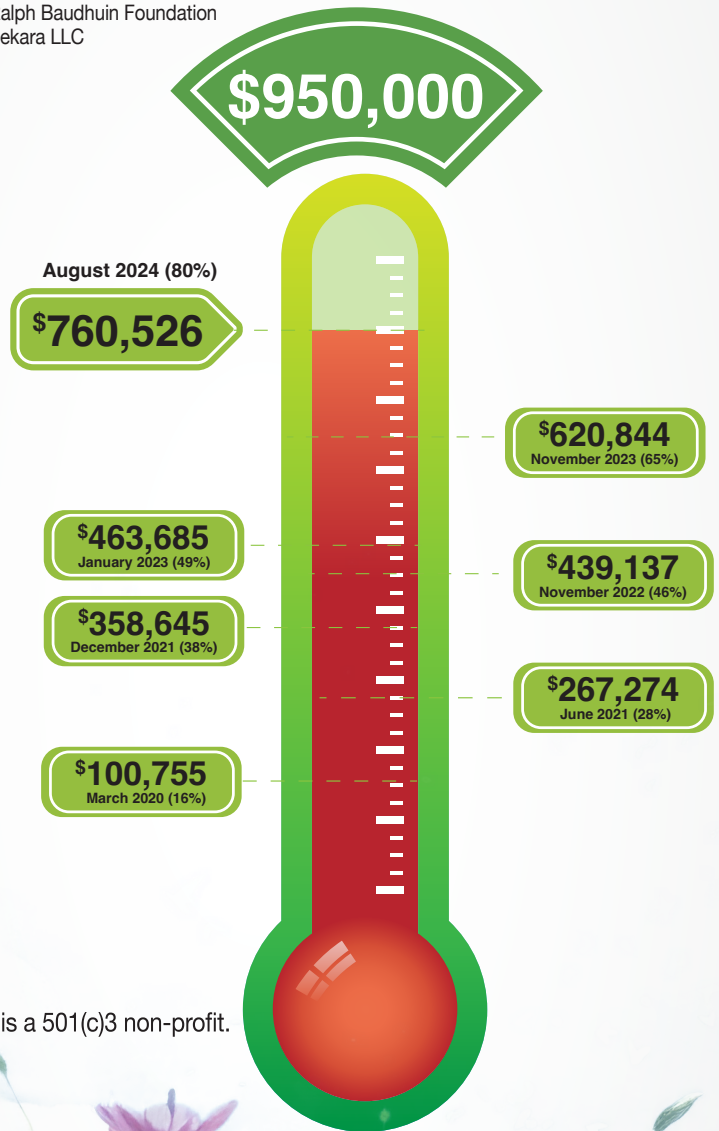
